

If you would love to work while surrounded by nature's beauty, and enjoy playing where there are still wide open spaces, then working for Nevada Division of State Parks may be for you.



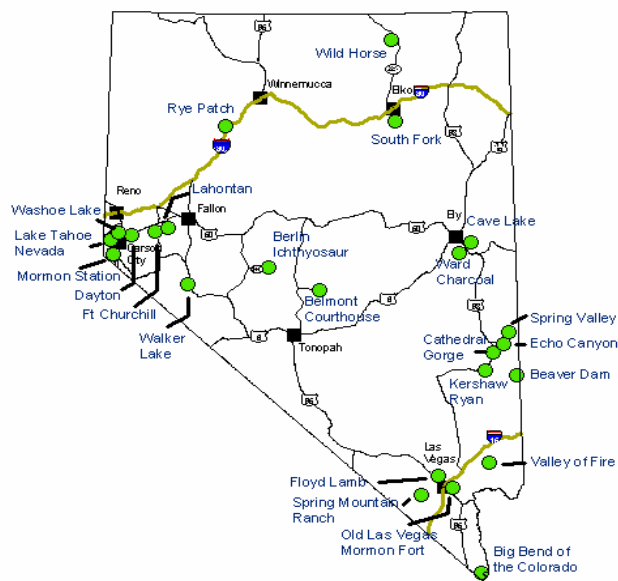

Working for Nevada State Parks is not a job, it's an adventure where you can test your outdoor skills, experience an unique lifestyle and at the same time protect and interpret nature's beauty. Nevada's State Parks are a diverse representation of the state's unique natural resources and historic places. They are historic ranch sites, beautiful lakes, old growth forests and even a section of the Colorado River. No matter what you prefer, Nevada State Parks has a place for you.

SEASONAL PARK AIDS perform routine general facility and equipment maintenance and custodial duties, assist visitors, collect fees, and assist in the operation of a state park. Requires high school graduation or equivalent and a Class C driver's license. This position can be a stepping stone to career advancement.

PARK RANGER TECHNICIANS perform grounds and facility maintenance, custodial duties, lead tours or hikes, collect fees and data, provide visitor services, assist in park operation and maintenance, and protect park resources and visitors. Requires high school graduation or equivalent and six months of park experience or equivalent combination of education and experience.

PARK RANGERS Both law enforcement and non-law enforcement positions perform visitor services, participate in operations and maintenance, and protect park resources and visitors. Application requires a bachelor's degree with a major or minor in park management, recreation management, ecology, forestry, biology or a related field or an equivalent combination of education and experience. Peace Officer certification is required for law enforcement positions and



can be obtained while employed at Nevada Division of State Parks.

PARK SUPERVISORS develop goals and objectives for operation and maintenance of facilities; research information and write interpretive materials; control and account for income and expenditures, prepare and administer budgets; recognize and plan appropriate actions to alleviate visitor impact/abuse on natural resources; enforce policies and procedures; protect park resources and visitors; and, manage personnel. Requires bachelor's degree with a major or minor in park management, outdoor recreation management, ecology, forestry, biology or a related field and two years of journey level experience or two years experience as a Park Ranger or an equivalent combination of education and experience.

PARK INTERPRETERS plan, organize, and supervise a variety of interpretive activities such as hikes, tours and teaching programs, and assist in park operation and maintenance. Requires bachelor's degree with a major or minor in park management, outdoor recreation management, history, education, ecology, forestry, biology or a related field and one year of professional park experience or equivalent combination of education and experience.



MAINTENANCE POSITIONS perform skilled work in plumbing, carpentry, painting, electrical, welding, and equipment maintenance and repair work. These positions use a wide variety of tools and equipment. They carry out preventative maintenance on buildings, grounds, vehicles and equipment. As caretakers of our parks, they work hard to keep them inviting and picturesque.
