Pursuant to NRS 233B.608 and 233B.609, NDSP is providing the following statements pertaining to the public hearing on proposed changes to Chapter 407 of the Nevada Administrative Code.

The need and purpose of the proposed regulation: The purpose of the proposed regulation is to update the administration of Nevada's state parks and recreation areas in NAC 407, including updating the definitions for parks and annual permits, out of state visitors, and updates the fees for annual day use and annual all access permits. The regulation also updates entrance fees associated with veterans, reflecting the conforming change set forth in Assembly Bill 102 of the 2021 Legislative Session eliminating the requirement that a person must provide proof to the Division of a permanent service-connected disability of 10 percent or more to obtain an all access annual permit for disabled veterans. This regulation authorizes the Division to collect such fees at a park or office maintained by the Division. Further, the regulation makes changes to refunds of fees or permit cost when privileges are rescinded due an infraction of park regulation.

The estimated economic effect of the proposed regulations on (a) regulated businesses and (b) the public, including, stated separately: (i) adverse and beneficial effects; and (ii) immediate and long-term effects:

## (a) Regulated businesses:

## (i) Adverse and beneficial effects:

NDSP anticipates no adverse effects, either direct or indirect, on regulated businesses as the result of the regulation. There will be no direct or indirect cost to regulated or small businesses. NDSP believes that there will be no beneficial effects, either direct or indirect, on regulated or small businesses as the result of these regulations.

## (ii) Immediate and long-term effects:

NDSP does not anticipate any immediate effects, either adverse or beneficial, on regulated or small businesses because of these regulations. NDSP does not anticipate any long-term effects, either adverse or beneficial, on regulated or small businesses because of these regulations.

## (b) The public:

## (i) Adverse and beneficial effects:

NDSP views most of the regulation changes primarily as housekeeping and does not anticipate adverse impacts to the public because of these regulations. The regulation change associated with the Disabled Veterans Annual Permit will benefit veterans by reducing the requirements to be eligible for the Disabled Veterans Annual Permit from 10% to "any" permanent service-connected disability (this will make the NAC consistent with NRS). The proposed changes will make permanent the temporary fee changes that were implemented earlier in the year, however based on feedback from visitors this does not seem to adversely impact the visitor / public. The largest benefit is that NDSP will be able to continue to operate its parks without a decrease in funding which would have resulted in a decrease in services being provided.

## (ii) Immediate and long-term effects:

NDSP anticipates the immediate and long-term effects will be that the agency will be able to maintain the same level of services that have been offered in the past as the increase in revenue will offset a reduction in general fund funding. One other immediate effect is that NAC and NRS will be consistent with language changes that are largely "housekeeping" in nature. The other long-term effect is that NDSP will have the regulations in place that would be necessary to begin renting out larger "group lodging" venues such as those located at the new Walker River State Recreation Area.

The estimated cost to the Division for enforcement of the proposed regulation: NDSP does not anticipate incurring any additional cost for these proposed permanent regulations.

The proposed regulation does not overlap or duplicate any existing regulation.

The proposed regulation is not required by federal law and there is no equivalent federal law.

The proposed regulation establishes a new fee for group lodging and makes permanent a statewide non-resident entrance fee and increases the cost of the Day Use and All Access Annual Permits which were increased as a temporary regulation change earlier in 2021.

Persons wishing to comment upon the proposed action of Nevada Division of State Parks may appear via virtual meeting or by telephone at the scheduled public hearing time or may address their comments, data, views, or arguments, in written form to Nevada Division of State Parks. 901 S. Stewart Street #5005, Carson City, NV 89701. Written submissions must be received by Nevada Division of State Parks on or before 1:00 p.m., October 25, 2021. If no person who is directly affected by the proposed action appears to request time to make an oral presentation, Division of State Parks may proceed immediately to act upon any written submission.

# PROPOSED REGULATION OF THE ADMINISTRATOR OF THE DIVISION OF STATE PARKS OF THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF CONSERVATION AND NATURAL RESOURCES

## LCB File No. R019-21

September 27, 2021

EXPLANATION - Matter in *italics* is new; matter in brackets [omitted material] is material to be omitted.

AUTHORITY: §§ 1-8, NRS 407.0475 and 407.065.

A REGULATION relating to state parks; authorizing the Division of State Parks of the State Department of Conservation and Natural Resources to collect certain fees at a park or office of the Division; revising certain requirements relating to the issuance of an all access annual permit for disabled veterans; revising provisions relating to certain fees for the use of parks; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

#### **Legislative Counsel's Digest:**

Existing law requires the Administrator of the Division of State Parks of the State Department of Conservation and Natural Resources to adopt such regulations as he or she finds necessary to carry out the provisions of chapter 407 of NRS governing state parks and recreational areas in this State. (NRS 407.0475) Existing law requires the Administrator to impose and collect fees for entering, camping and boating in state parks and recreational areas in this State. (NRS 407.065) Existing law also authorizes the Administrator to collect a fee for the repair, operation and maintenance of sewer, water, communication and electrical systems. (NRS 407.0765, as amended by section 2 of Senate Bill No. 53, chapter 23, Statutes of Nevada 2021, at page 98) **Section 1** of this regulation authorizes the Division to collect such fees at a park or office maintained by the Division.

Existing law provides for the issuance of: (1) annual permits that authorize a holder to enter and use the facilities at each state park and recreational area in the State without paying the entrance fee; and (2) annual permits that authorize a holder to enter and use the facilities of a specific state park or recreational area without paying the entrance fee. (NRS 407.065) Existing regulations provide for the issuance of: (1) all access permits, which authorize the holder to enter, camp and boat in all parks without paying certain fees; and (2) annual permits, which authorize the holder to enter, camp and boat in a specific state park or recreational area without

paying the entrance fee. (NAC 407.052, 407.055) **Section 2** of this regulation replaces the term "all access permit" with "all access annual permit." **Section 3** of this regulation replaces the term "annual permit" with "day use annual permit." **Sections 5, 6 and 7** of this regulation make conforming changes to reflect this change in terminology. **Section 5** specifies that an all access annual permit does not authorize the holder to attend special events. **Section 6** increases, from \$200 to \$250, the fee for an all access annual permit. **Section 6** also increases, from \$75 to \$100, the fee for a day use annual permit for the use of certain parks. Finally, **section 6** imposes an additional entrance fee of \$5 per vehicle for each vehicle per day that is not registered with the Nevada Department of Motor Vehicles.

Under existing law, the Division is required to issue an annual permit to certain persons without charge. (NRS 407.065) Assembly Bill No. 102 of the 2021 Legislative Session eliminates the requirement that certain veterans must have incurred a permanent service-connected disability of 10 percent or more in order to be eligible to receive such a permit without charge. (Section 1 of Assembly Bill No. 102, chapter 103, Statutes of Nevada 2021, at page 439) **Section 4** makes a conforming change relating to the provisions of Assembly Bill No. 102 by eliminating the requirement that a person must provide proof to the Division of a permanent service connected disability of 10 percent or more to obtain an all access annual park permit for disabled veterans.

Existing regulations limit the fees the Division may charge and collect for camping reservations. (NAC 407.050) **Section 4** of this regulation clarifies that: (1) a third-party system or vendor may impose a fee or service charge for making camping reservations in a park; and (2) such a charge or fee is in addition to and not subject to the limitations applicable to the Division. **Section 4** also limits the fee the Division may charge and collect for the reservation of lodging for large groups to not more than \$2,500 per day.

Existing regulations provide that fees charged for the use of a park will not be refunded if the user's privileges are rescinded as a result of the infraction of a park regulation. (NAC 407.060) **Section 8** of this regulation provides that administrative fees collected for the issuance of a permit will not be refunded if the user's privileges are rescinded or a permit is revoked as a result of the infraction of a park regulation.

**Section 1.** Chapter 407 of NAC is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section to read as follows:

A fee imposed pursuant to NRS 407.065 or 407.0765, as amended by section 2 of Senate Bill No. 53, chapter 23, Statutes of Nevada 2021, at page 98, may be collected by the Division at a park or office maintained by the Division.

**Sec. 2.** NAC 407.00605 is hereby amended to read as follows:

407.00605 "All access *annual* permit" means a permit that, for 12 months, authorizes the holder to enter all parks and use the facilities of the parks without paying the entrance, camping or boating fees imposed pursuant to NAC 407.055.

**Sec. 3.** NAC 407.0062 is hereby amended to read as follows:

407.0062 ["Annual] "Day use annual permit" means a permit which, for 12 months, authorizes the holder to enter a park and use the facilities of the park without paying the entrance fee imposed pursuant to NAC 407.055.

- **Sec. 4.** NAC 407.050 is hereby amended to read as follows:
- 407.050 1. The Division will issue a permit for senior citizens to a person who is a resident of Nevada and applies for such a permit if the person:
  - (a) Is 65 years of age or older;
  - (b) Pays a \$30 administrative fee to the Division;
  - (c) Provides proof of age and residence in Nevada to the Division; and
- (d) Possesses a Nevada driver's license or an identification card issued by the Department of Motor Vehicles.
- A permit for senior citizens authorizes the holder to enter, camp in and boat in all parks for 12 months after the date the permit is issued. The permit does not authorize the use of hook-ups without payment of the fee set forth in this section.
- 2. The Division will issue a permit for disabled veterans to a person who is a resident of Nevada and applies for such a permit if the person:
  - (a) Provides proof to the Division of:

- (1) A permanent service-connected disability; [of 10 percent or more;]
- (2) The status required by NRS 407.065;
- (3) An honorable discharge from the Armed Forces of the United States; and
- (4) Residence in Nevada; and
- (b) Pays a \$30 administrative fee to the Division.
- A permit for disabled veterans authorizes the holder to enter, camp in and boat in all parks for 12 months after the date the permit is issued. The permit does not authorize the use of hook-ups without payment of the fee set forth in this section.
- 3. The Division may issue a permit that authorizes the landing of not more than two nonemergency aircraft in designated areas of a park. If the Division issues such a permit, the Division will charge a fee of \$200 per event per day for the permit.
  - 4. The Division will charge and collect the following fees:

- (c) For making a campingreservation for individual campsitesor cabins or related activities in a

- 5. For commercial bus tours, the Division will charge and collect the established entrance fee or \$2 per person, whichever is greater, or the fee established by a special use permit. A special use permit may provide for monthly billings.
- 6. For each day or partial day that a person engages in an activity requiring a photography permit in a park pursuant to section 3 of LCB File No. R123-20, the Division will charge and collect the following fee according to the total number of vehicles or the total number of persons, whichever results in a higher fee:

or Persons Fee Per Day

Class A: 1 to 3 vehicles or 2 to 15 persons	\$50
Class B: 4 to 7 vehicles or 16 to 30 persons	200
Class C: 8 to 11 vehicles or 31 to 50 persons	350

Class E: 16 to 20 vehicles or 76 to 100 persons	800
Class F: 21 to 50 vehicles or 101 to 400 persons	,100
Class G: More than 50 vehicles or more than 400 persons	.500

- 7. A person may request an annual class A photography permit for the activities that require a photography permit pursuant to section 3 of LCB File No. R123-20. Upon approval of such a request, the Division will charge and collect from the person a fee of \$500. An annual class A photography permit will be recognized at all parks for 12 months after the date of issuance. A person to whom is issued an annual class A photography permit shall:
- (a) Pay the entrance fee required pursuant to NAC 407.055 each time he or she enters a park to engage in an activity requiring a photography permit pursuant to section 3 of LCB File No. R123-20;
- (b) Maintain adequate insurance coverage for the entire period he or she holds such a permit and provide proof to the Division of such coverage;

- (c) Contact in advance the office of the park that he or she intends to use to confirm the availability of the areas where the person intends to engage in an activity requiring a photography permit pursuant to section 3 of LCB File No. R123-20; and
  - (d) Obtain a special use permit if a special use permit is required pursuant NAC 407.053.
- 8. A park supervisor or regional manager in charge of a region in which a park is located may determine the area of the park that can be used under a photography permit.
- 9. A person who has obtained a photography permit may request that the Division reserve an area within the park for use on a specific day in accordance with the terms of the permit.

  Upon approval of such a request, the Division will charge and collect from the person a reservation fee of \$100. The reservation fee is in addition to any fee charged and collected pursuant to subsection 6 or 7.
- 10. The Division may not charge an entrance fee for the park for a reporter or other person who is employed in any news media, including, without limitation, newspapers and television.
- 11. If a user of a park does not deposit the required fee in the available self-service devices, the Division:
  - (a) Must charge the user a fee of \$10 for collection service, in addition to other fees; and
  - (b) May file criminal charges against the user for theft as defined in NRS 205.0832.
- 12. For each special use permit or commercial use permit, the Division will charge a processing fee of \$25 in addition to any other fee charged for the permit.
- 13. The Division must reduce by \$1 any entrance fee established pursuant to this chapter charged to a person who upon entrance to the park:
  - (a) Presents a disability placard;

- (b) Is in a vehicle displaying a special license plate for persons with disabilities;
- (c) Is in a vehicle displaying a special license plate for veterans; or
- (d) Presents a military identification card issued by any branch of the Armed Forces of the United States.
- 14. Nothing in this section shall be construed to prohibit a third-party system or vendor from imposing a fee or service charge for making a camping reservation in a park. Such a service charge or fee is in addition to and not subject to the limitation set forth in paragraph (c) of subsection 4.
  - **Sec. 5.** NAC 407.052 is hereby amended to read as follows:
- 407.052 1. A person who applies for an all access *annual* permit will be issued such a permit upon payment of a fee of [\$200] \$250 pursuant to NAC 407.055.
- 2. An all access *annual* permit issued pursuant to subsection 1 authorizes the holder of the permit to enter, camp in and boat in all parks without paying the entrance, camping and boating fees imposed by NAC 407.055. An all access *annual* permit does not authorize the holder of the permit to *attend special events or* use a hook-up.
  - **Sec. 6.** NAC 407.054 is hereby amended to read as follows:
  - 407.054 1. [An] A day use annual permit does not authorize the holder to:
  - (a) Engage in camping or boating;
  - (b) Attend special events; or
  - (c) Use a hook-up.

- 2. The holder of [an] a day use annual permit who wishes to engage in camping or boating, to attend special events or to use a hook-up must pay the fee established for the respective activity.
  - **Sec. 7.** NAC 407.055 is hereby amended to read as follows:
- 407.055 1. Except as otherwise provided in NAC 407.050, or unless waived, the Division will charge and collect the following fees for the use of parks:

- 2. A person who pays a camping fee for a park pursuant to subsection 1 is authorized to use the camping facilities of the park from 2 p.m. until 11 a.m.
- 3. A person who pays an entrance fee pursuant to subsection 1 is not authorized to use the facilities of the park from 10 p.m. until 6 a.m. unless the person also pays the camping fee for the park.
- 4. The Division will charge and collect from each person who rides a bicycle or horse, walks or enters by a nonmotorized vessel into a park an entrance fee of \$2.

- 5. The Division will not charge a fee for any vehicle that is towed into a park.
- 6. The Division will charge, in addition to any other fee imposed pursuant to this chapter, a fee of [\$5]:
- (a) Five dollars for each watercraft in excess of two that is launched from a boat ramp or set adrift from shore.
  - (b) Five dollars per day for each vehicle that:
- (1) Enters a park for which an entrance fee has been established by the Administrator; and
  - (2) Is not registered with the Nevada Department of Motor Vehicles.
- 7. If a person purchases an annual permit to a park for a vehicle, the person may purchase at the same time a second annual permit to the same park at a discounted price equal to one-half of the price of the annual permit. The annual permit purchased at a discounted price must be for a vehicle registered to the same owner at the same residence as the owner of the vehicle for which the permit was purchased at regular price.
  - **Sec. 8.** NAC 407.060 is hereby amended to read as follows:
- 407.060 Fees charged for the use of a park, including, without limitation, administrative fees collected by the Division for the issuance of a permit, will not be refunded if the user's privileges are rescinded or the permit is revoked as a result of the infraction of a park regulation.
