Project Narrative

Describe how this project fits with current community development plans.

Current Plans*:

There are currently no permanent facilities in Gold Bute National Monument (GBNM); this multi-use trailhead project would be the first developed site and has been chosen by BLM's Outdoor Recreation Planner for development to improve public access and promote appropriate use of a popular multi-use route within the Monument.

This site has long historical ad-hoc use by Mesquite and Bunkerville residents. It's elevation and easy access from the city make it a place that has been used to get relief from summer heat and access the higher reaches of the Virgin Mountains. There are several interesting stories recorded by the Virgin Valley Historical Museum relating to local families using the area as a summer camp and swimming hole, as well as an orchard, in the early 1900's (see attached supplemental information).

During the Spanish Flu pandemic, The Bunkerville Normal School, which trained teachers for the local schools, was moved to this site to allow the school to continue operation during the pandemic by being isolated from the community. The school was run out of a tent with a solid wood flooring. The Normal School graduated three classes (one year for each class) during this period.

This site has been regularly used as a recreation site to escape summer heat. In the mid 60's local volunteer community members with donated materials poured a concrete pad, several concrete picnic tables, and concrete steps down to a previously rocked swimming hole. These are all still existing at the site, but severely deteriorated. In the early 2000's the City of Mesquite, Clark County, and BLM started planning a project to refurbish this site, but this project was never executed. There continues to be community interest in re-developing this location which guided the BLM selection of this site for development.

As a relatively new National Monument, the GBNM Resource Management Plan is under development, so it is currently being managed under the guidelines of the BLM Southern Nevada Resource Management Plan. This project would be the first developed facility in the monument.

Describe the project?s ability to enhance recreation options for an underserved area or population. ?Underserved? is defined as an area or population with inadequate services, facilities, and/or a lack of access to recreation opportunities.

Underserved Area or Population*:

The White Rock/Cabin Canyon site within the 300,000 acres of Gold Butte National Monument, is the closest part of GBNM to Mesquite and Bunkerville, Nevada. GBNM is the closest outdoor recreation area to Mesquite and Bunkerville, and was recently established as a National Monument in 2016. As such, it currently has no developed facilities or services. Since Cabin Canyon is a high elevation area with cooler temperatures, it is used by locals as a nearby alternative to escape the summer heat. Some potential users to GBNM are excluded due to the lack of developed facilities so this expands the number of potential users.

Project Quality

Describe project schedule(s) and contingency plans.

Schedule and Plans*:

If approved, the materials for this multi-use trailhead project would be ordered as soon as environmental compliance is documented. The vendor, CTX Industries, would be scheduled for the soonest possible delivery and installation of the vault toilet. Jimmy Linares, BLM Outdoor Recreation Planner for GBNM, will schedule BLM's manpower and will work with the Friends of Gold Butte to schedule volunteers for preparing and installing the rest of the improvements. The project may be completed altogether in a few days but if material supply issues happen, the project may have staggered partial completion dates.

Describe the confirmed partnerships for this project.

Partnerships*:

This project has been planned in conjunction with Jimmy Linares, BLM Outdoor Recreation Planner for Gold Butte National Monument.

Other community organizations and city governments are being contacted to collaborate with the Friends of Gold Butte for long-term monitoring and maintenance of the trailhead facilities.

While not a youth-focused organization, Friends of Gold Butte has sponsored field trips for various diversified youth organizations to Gold Butte National Monument and we sponsor a local youth art contest. Installation of basic amenities at the trailhead to Cabin Canyon will allow this particular area to be a destination for future youth field trips.

How will the project contribute (or otherwise complement) the development, maintenance, and/or management of new outdoor recreation facilities?

New Outdoor Recreation Facilities*:

This project is an important first step to the development of permanent outdoor recreation facilities in Gold Butte National Monument, which is in the process of developing a Resource Management Plan as a National Monument. Several more important recreational sites within the Monument, which tie in to the Cabin Canyon multi-use trail, will be looked at in future years for permanent facilities.

How does the project contribute to the economic vitality of its community?

Economic Vitality*:

The Cabin Canyon area is a popular destination for OHV enthusiasts and hikers. The lack of any developed facilities limits the Monument's appeal and excludes some from exploring the Monument. Providing these very basic amenities at the trailhead increases the usability of the area and will attract more tourism to the Mesquite/Bunkerville area as a springboard to GBNM. These basic facilities allow visitors to enjoy the area utilizing "Leave No Trace" principles which keeps the area enjoyable for all visitors.

How will the project contribute to the conservation and/or rehabilitation of water and habitat?

Water and Habitat*:

This site will continue to be heavily used with or without facilities. Installation of the very basic facilities of a toilet and trash receptacle protects the surrounding habitat from having to absorb the waste and litter some people leave behind. The information kiosk will explain the importance and fragility of the surrounding area and will encourage good stewardship and "Leave No Trace" practices.

Applicant History

Grant Management Record*:

Friends of Gold Butte is a non-profit organization that has been principally grant funded since gaining non-profit status in 2009. FoGB has been awarded and managed numerous private, corporate, and governmental grants supporting the mission of the organization, including paid personnel, a visitors center, organization activities, events, and stewardship projects. Friends of Gold Butte has applied for and received grants from the Nevada Department of Transportation for the construction and installation of directional signs and kiosks in Gold Butte National Monument, done in collaboration with the BLM.

We also have a long history of accomplishments related to infrastructure, maintenance and promotion of the Monument. In 2019, in collaboration with the BLM, Clark County Public Works, local hiking and OHV groups and the Great Basin Institute, Friends of Gold Butte staff and volunteers laid 200 tons of cold patch asphalt along a 12 mile stretch of Gold Butte Road.

Graffiti remediation is handled on an as-needed basis, approximately 4-5 times per year, and amounts to a full day's work for multiple volunteers at each site. We run monthly trash clean-ups which are a popular volunteer project drawing people from as far away as Las Vegas and St. George, Utah. Since 2017 we have removed over 4000 pounds of garbage from the highly used parts of the Monument.

We partner with various organizations for larger projects such as incursion repair and restoration, reforestation, invasive plant removal, and native seed collection. These projects are conducted in collaboration with the BLM, Nevada Division of Wildlife, Nevada Division of Forestry and others, depending on the nature of the project.

Describe your organization?s capacity to maintain facilities for the next 25 years.

Maintain Program*:

BLM has committed to having the vault toilet pumped on a regular basis. Trash collection, monitoring and cleaning the site will be performed by volunteers from several organizations as organized by Friends of Gold Butte.

Friends of Gold Butte currently organizes volunteers to monitor and maintain the more than 400 miles of trails in the Monument. Volunteers monitor and report on the condition of the trails and Friends of Gold Butte organizes volunteer clean-up and remediation on an as-needed basis. As described above, our volunteer trash clean-ups are a popular project and generally attract between 15-20 volunteers each time. Friends of Gold Butte has had an active contingent of volunteers, including many members of the Kokopelli ATV Club, for the past decade.




