This project takes a Park that is currently being applied for through SNPLMA (Heritage Park) and connects it with natural area on BLM land as well as Trails such as the Ice Plant Canyon trail and the Ward Charcoal Ovens. White Pine County offers a wide variety of outdoor activities including historic Ward Charcoal

Ovens, Lehman Caves, several lakes, a glacier and the Nevada Northern Railway Museum including restoration and operation of historic railroad equipment. In addition, miles of hiking and mountain biking trails, camping, hunting, and star gazing in some of the darkest skies in the United States. All of these opportunities provide many avenues for economic development.

Describe the project?s ability to enhance recreation options for an underserved area or population. ?Underserved? is defined as an area or population with inadequate services, facilities, and/or a lack of access to recreation opportunities.

Underserved Area or Population*:

Because parts of this path will be more level than mountain biking paths in the area, it reengages participants such as youth and elderly who may not be able to do more intense trails such as ice plant canyon. While doing this, it still allows for access to the more intense trails in the area by allowing connection to them from this trail.

Project Quality

Schedule and Plans*:

It is estimated that this project will take no longer than 6 months. It is anticipated that the project would start in the early spring to allow for the best weather possible during this planning study.

Partnerships*:

Though there are no confirmed partnerships for this project, there has been coordination between the Local Forrest Service office and White Pine Tourism and Recreation on the plan for this project.

Public Engagement*:

As part of the preliminary design for this project, public scoping will occur to ensure that the preliminary design for this project has input from those that will be utilizing the trail. Once a complete plan for the project location is decided, public input will occur to ensure that this is what the community wants.

Project Phases*:

With any grant project, the County strictly follows the our grant management and purchase order policies to ensure proper management and procurement. For this phase of the project, coordination with BLM, Forrest Service and other key entities will occur to ensure all necessary requirements and practices are followed.

How does the project promote sustainability goals and principles (e.g., social, environmental, economic) in the design criteria?

Sustainability*:

The County plans to make this path as low maintenance and self-sustainable as possible with cost and energy efficient materials. With the goal of the trail being as natural, low maintenance and self-sustaining as possible, it is believed that the maintenance will be minimal but may require periodic maintenance as any other trail in the area requires.

Alignment with Nevada?s Recreation Goals

How will project planning activities contribute to the maintenance and/or rehabilitation of existing outdoor infrastructure?

Existing Outdoor Infrastructure*:

No, the planning activities will not contribute to the maintenance of existing infrastructure. However. This project will provide for a new form of transportation to existing infrastructure and historical site known as the Ward Charcoal Ovens thus increasing the number of visitors viewing and appreciating it.

How will planning activities incorporate safety into the design, maintenance, and management of the project?

Safety*:

The goal for this planning study is to develop the best route for this trail in order to encompass all aspects of safety, sustainability and management. The County is applying for a plan that will allow for a location that is going to do the best job at allowing a safe and sustainable trail that also allows for various skill levels. Allowing for various skill levels with alternate routes will allow for users to stay safe on a trail that meets their skills while recreating with friends and family that may have higher skill levels rather than having to risk safety by going on a higher skilled trail.

How will planning activities lead to a more comprehensive approach to linking existing trails that connect communities and trail users?

Connectivity*:

White Pine County is known for its various mountain bike trails throughout the area. Mountain biking is one of the County's biggest tourism attractions. This project will connect to the Ward Charcoal Ovens and would allow for people to mountain bike to this unique historical site. This connects outdoor recreation to White Pine County's history and culture while increasing White Pine County's Mountain Biking reputation. This project will provide an access from Ely to various mountain trails and the Ward Charcoal ovens without having to use highways or roads. This project creates a new legitimate trail that connects not only to a newly developing Heritage Park, but the Ward Charcoal Ovens, Ice Plant Canyon and to natural areas on BLM and Forrest Service land.

Does the plan address the need to engage youth in the design, development, and use of trails?

Youth Engagement*:

The trailhead for this project will be located at a newly developing park to be known as "Heritage Park". This park is adjacent to the local high school and Community college. The location of this trailhead is perfect for engaging youth in outdoor recreation and may even provide hiking opportunities for physical education classes. Youth may use the trail during lunch breaks or after school with the location being easily accessible and nearby. With a trail that provides for various levels of recreation, youth has more ability to take part in mountain biking or hiking without risk of injury. The trail will encourage group and family use thus encouraging kids to recreate with family and friends.

Does the plan describe how new outdoor recreation facilities will be developed, maintained, and/or managed?

New Outdoor Recreation Facilities*:

Yes. This plan will explain why the selected route or routes were suggested in order to create a trail with the County's goals such as safety, sustainability and versatility in mind. The plan will include identifying concern, uniqueness, cost savings, energy savings and more.

How do planning activities, or the planned project, contribute to the economic vitality of the community?

Economic Vitality*:

Ely would be the closest community to benefit however, it is believed that large group of mountain bikers and members of all County townships would also be drawn to the area as well as a large amount of tourists. This project expands the County's already booming Mountain biking opportunities throughout the area and near Cave Valley and Ward Mountain in particular. Revenue from tourists is a large portion or the Counties revenue and any project that promotes tourism will contribute to the community.

Describe how conservation and/or rehabilitation of water and habitat have been incorporated into the planning activities.

Water and Habitat*:

Providing a legitimate trail for recreators to utilize allows less destruction of natural land and habitat. Though this project is not anticipated to have any impact on water, if the planning study shows any potential for this, plans will include best practices for low impact designs and/or maintenance procedures.

Grant Management Record*:

To date, White Pine County has received and closed 9 Southern Nevada Public Land Management Act (SNPLMA) grants. The County is currently managing 5 more, 2 of which are nearly completed. The County has very recently been awarded 3 more multi million dollar SNPLMA grants that are anticipated to start planning in the Spring of 2022. The County has received and closed out dozens or Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) projects totaling nearly \$4 million. The County also manages dozens of small grants for various departments such as PPE for the Fire Station, programs for the library, equipment for the Sherriff's office and much more.

Maintain Program*:

White Pine County has full time parks and maintenance staff as well as seasonal staff that will allow for proper maintenance of the trail. The County also anticipates increasing these staff numbers in upcoming years.






