

The Tahoe Interagency Bear Team

The Tahoe Interagency Bear Team (TIBT) is a coalition of wildlife professionals and land managers from across the Lake Tahoe Basin, including the California Department of Fish and Wildlife, Nevada Department of Wildlife, USDA Forest Service, California and Nevada State Parks, and local law enforcement agencies.



The team was formed in response to a rise in human-bear conflicts around Tahoe, as both residential growth and tourism brought people into

closer contact with black bears. By working together, these agencies ensure a unified approach to bear management and public education, reducing confusion and strengthening community trust.

At the heart of the team's work is a commitment to public education and outreach. Through programs like BearWise, the TIBT provides clear, science-based guidance on how residents and visitors can live and recreate responsibly in bear country. This includes practical advice on securing food and trash, understanding bear behavior, and avoiding actions that inadvertently encourage bears to become habituated to humans. The team also works to dispel myths, such as the idea that feeding bears helps them survive, by explaining how such practices actually endanger both bears and people.

Tahoe's Bear Aware Festival

The Tahoe Bear Fest is returning to Spooner Lake State Park on Saturday, September 20, 11:00 AM - 3:00 PM, following a successful inaugural event last year. Hosted by TIBT, the festival celebrates Tahoe's iconic black bears while teaching the community how to live responsibly alongside them. The event brings together wildlife experts and community partners to share knowledge about bear biology, behavior, and safety in a fun, family-friendly setting.
