Cave Lake State Park

A Brief History

Cave Lake State Park, established in 1973, is a picturesque Nevada State Park located in the Schell Creek Range of White Pine County, Nevada, approximately 14 miles southeast of Ely. The park encompasses over 4,000 acres and is situated at an elevation of around 7,300 feet, offering visitors a serene mountain landscape.

Central to the park is the 32-acre Cave Lake, originally created in 1939 by the Isbell Construction Company to serve as a water storage reservoir for the CCC Ranch in Steptoe Valley. Over the years, the lake and surrounding lands changed ownership several times before being acquired by the Nevada Department of Wildlife in 1971 for a nominal fee. Two years later, the area was designated as a state park, expanding its recreational offerings to the public.



A Recreational Oasis

The park offers a variety of recreational activities year-round. Anglers can enjoy fishing for German brown trout and hatchery-stocked rainbow trout in the lake and its feeder streams. The park's diverse wildlife includes elk, mule deer, bobcats, mountain lions, and coyotes, providing ample opportunities for wildlife observation.

Hiking enthusiasts can explore several developed trails that wind through the park's varied terrain, offering scenic views and chances to encounter local flora and fauna. During the winter months, the park becomes a hub for ice fishing, ice skating, cross-country skiing, and snowmobiling, attracting visitors seeking cold-weather adventures.

Rediscover Adventure

In recent years, Cave Lake underwent significant rehabilitation due to necessary dam repairs. The lake was drained in 2019 to facilitate construction, temporarily halting water-based recreational activities. Despite the lake's closure, the park's campgrounds and trails remained accessible to visitors. As of December 2024, construction on the dam has been completed, and the lake is in the process of refilling, with plans to reopen for public use once all equipment is removed and final maintenance is concluded.

A Day for Celebration

The long-awaited return of Cave Lake is happening faster than expected, and to celebrate, Nevada State Parks, in coordination with the Nevada Department of Wildlife and White Pine County, is hosting a grand celebration marking the first summer of recreation at Cave Lake in five years! This large-scale event will bring the community together for a full day of outdoor fun, activities, and entertainment in honor of the lake's revitalization. With its crystal-clear waters refilling ahead of schedule and fish stockings planned throughout the spring to rebuild and enhance the fishery, visitors can once again enjoy fishing, kayaking, and swimming in one of Nevada's most scenic mountain parks.

The celebration will feature a ribbon-cutting ceremony, live music, food vendors, and a variety of family-friendly activities, including a Float Tube Fly Fishing Clinic, mountain bike rides, and guided hikes showcasing the park's incredible wildlife and landscapes. Local businesses and organizations are invited to participate with booths, demonstrations, and sponsorship opportunities to help make this event a true community-wide welcome back to Cave Lake. Join us as we commemorate this milestone and create new memories in a park that has been beloved by generations of outdoor enthusiasts!



Attendance

Based on historical data, regional trends, and the unique elements of Cave Lake State Park, we anticipate attendance to range between 1,500 and 3,500 participants. This projection is grounded in several key factors:

Parking Capacity Estimate:

• If each vehicle carries an average of 2 to 4 people, and 300-400 vehicles are expected, that results in: 600 to 1,600 attendees from parked vehicles.

Campground Attendance:

Assuming an average of 3 to 6 people per campsite across 34 sites, that adds 102 to 204 attendees from the campground.

Comparison to Similar Events:

- Fire & Ice Festival: 1,500 attendees
- Fishing Derby: 800 attendees

Given the significance of this event (a grand reopening), attendance is likely to be on the higher end of the spectrum, potentially exceeding 1,000.

Advertising & Media Impact:

With major media exposure in Reno and Las Vegas, the event could attract 1,000 to 3,000 attendees based on travel feasibility, weather conditions, and public interest.

Estimated Total Attendance Range:


Taking all factors into account, a reasonable estimate for attendance at Rediscover Cave Lake would be **1,500 to 3,500** attendees.
